



Suddenly, the rug is pulled out from under her. When she loses each one of her sisters, in some way, she begins to understand how little control she actually has. But how can she go on? She's quickly losing her grasp on her carefully-planned future.

Marmee, as always, is there for her. After sharing some wisdom with her struggling daughter, she leaves Jo alone with her thoughts. The song "The Fire Within Me" details Jo's journey in such a touching and beautiful way. She learns that her sisters are more important than her dreams, and they will always be with her. In realizing this truth, and letting go of what she thought she knew, she somehow finally reaches her dream of being a famous writer. She learns that love is "A Small Umbrella in the Rain," that each day can be amazing, and that dreams come true in extraordinary ways. The world, her world, is her family--and they are waiting for her.

Little Women reminds us that, at the end of the day, our most important accomplishments happen within the walls of our own homes and neighborhoods, with those we call our family and friends. They're all that truly matter.

We hope this show takes you to a peaceful place, where you can enjoy the warmth of a tale that belongs to all of us--for this is your story of love and loss, heartache and disappointment, sprinkled with a touch of humor and good cheer. It reminds us that there will always be hope, love, and memories.

To our cast and crew, family and neighbors, and our wonderful audience, thank you for being a part of this show tonight. You're amazing, astonishing, and we're so glad you're here! Welcome to the family!
